

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WHEREAS, on August 3, 2005, the City Council adopted Ordinance No. 176908 (CF 04-2085) imposing interim regulations on the issuance of building permits for certain structures in the Sunland-Tujunga area and,

WHEREAS, within the Sunland-Tujunga area, R1-zoned lots are typically smaller than the City's minimum lot area standard of 5,000 square feet. Builders were acquiring these substandard lots and building maximum boxes: unarticulated two-story houses that extended to the set back lines on all sides and.

WHEREAS, the proliferation of such structures continues to raise concerns in the community regarding undesirable aesthetic impacts caused by these uses. The visual blight created by the over concentration of these structures has contributed to an erosion of the small town character of Sunland-Tujunga and,

WHEREAS, study is ongoing to determine the appropriate measures to adequately regulate the size of residents citywide; and,

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 176908 will expire on September 25, 2006 which is earlier than the proposed land use restrictions would be effectuated and interim measures continue to be necessary to protect the health and safety of the community by regulating uses that would be potentially detrimental; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council may, by resolution, extend the provisions of this Ordinance for two periods of six months each, so long as the City Council makes the following finding: That the appropriate City agencies and officials are exercising due diligence to assure that the permanent land use regulations that regulate the size of residences in the area subject to the Interim Control Ordinance are being expeditiously processed;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council hereby finds: That the appropriate City agencies and officials are exercising due diligence to assure that the permanent land use regulations that regulate the size of residences in the area subject to the Interim Control Ordinance are being expeditiously processed;

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that City Council hereby extends by Resolution, Ordinance No. 176908 imposing interim regulations on the issuance of building permits for certain structures in the Sunland-Tujunga area for one period of six months, or until such time as other permanent land use regulations that regulate the size of residences in the area subject to the Interim Control Ordinance are imposed.
